Director's Report

June 2023

NEW INFORMATION

1. Handyman and Renovation Services:

a. We had initiated contact with Mr. Joshua Fisher, who seemed to believe that our desired services could be achieved for a cost significantly lower than our previous quotations. His recommendations are also commendable. However, despite our attempts to engage further, we have not received a response from his end. Thus, we have initiated the process to find an alternative handyman. 🗸 🕻 🖡

2. Pre-Kindergarten Final Payment:

a. The final payment for the pre-kindergarten program, amounting to \$2,000, has been communicated to the school. We are expecting to receive the final invoice shortly.

3. Carpet Cleaning Services:

a. The annual carpet cleaning service, provided by Jim's Dry Cleaning, is scheduled for June 28th. The estimated cost is \$825. Please note, we received a call last Friday indicating a need to reschedule. Further updates will follow.

4. Summer Reading Program:

- a. Our summer reading program is well underway. We began signups on June 20th and officially launched on June 22nd at the local park. We have also tested a new QR code self-sign up method with great success. We've had substantial support so far, including a mural painted by local artist Sarah Hogg.
- b. Program Details:
 - Children must read for a minimum of 15 minutes per day.

- ii. Consistent reading will qualify them for an entry into a prize draw tailored to their age group.
- iii. The program concludes on August 7th, with weekly prizes including books and snacks.

5. Tutoring sessions with Jennifer Restivo.

a. Tutoring: Every Wednesday, from 9:30 to 11:30 am, we have arranged for Jennifer Restivo, an elementary teacher from SCCS, to tutor children here at the library. The students will come from the local daycare. We will provide her with a key to the library for these sessions.

6. Construction Grant:

- a. This year, approximately \$800,000 is available system-wide for grants.
- b. The library will bear 10% to 25% of the total cost of selected projects.
- c. We are currently considering the following upgrades:
 - i. AC unit replacement or upgrade
 - ii. Electrical system update
 - iii. Generator addition
 - iv. Repaying the parking lot '

7. Incident Report:
